European Sturgeon – French National Plan of Actions (NPA) and involvement of French fishermen









Target species & main conservation issues

- **European Sturgeon** : Acipenser sturio
- ➤ <u>IUCN Status</u>: Critically Endangered Species

Alarming situation of the wild population (a few hundred spawners) due to river artificialization, dam building, intensive fishing, aggregate extractions ...


Remaining sites for reproduction: Gironde-Garonne-Dordogne basin.

Protected by French legislation since 1982 (ex : targeted fishing prohibited)

NPA for the European Sturgeon since 2011 (2nd phase for 2020-2029) 4 axes :

- Conservation in captivity,
 - Restocking (since 2007),
 - Sensitization,
 - The collection of fishers' observations







Situation of fishing communities

European sturgeon = patrimonial species in the Gironde Estuary


Involvement of the professional fishers since 1970's alerting about the decline of the European sturgeon

Ban on sturgeon fishing since 1982 → No commercial fishing, only accidental catches

Participation of fishermen in tagging campaigns since 1983-1985









Appreciation scheme for fishermen reporting bycatch

Why and how are fishermen part of the solution?

Very few sturgeon remaining \rightarrow monitoring difficulties + each fish is important

Set up the best practices in sturgeon release to improve the survival of the individuals: 98,2 % of sturgeons are released alive by French fishermen

Fishermen = scientists essential partners thanks to bycatch data :

- Monitor the wild population
- Follow up on the restocking program

Fishermen = estuarine advocates and sentinels using Sturgeon as a control species to:

- Defend and protect estuarine environments, which shelter its essential habitats (nurseries),
- Defend and protect habitats of other exploited species against all physical damage: dredging, artificialization, etc.





Appreciation scheme for fishermen reporting bycatch



What are your achievements so far? How do you measure them?

Hope for a potential reproduction in the coming years: more fishes are observed in fresh waters since 2020 (Libourne – Dordogne).

Since 2006 a strong network of fishers was built in the Gironde-Dordogne basin as an example of successful collaboration:


- A very high level of accidental catch reports: 1883 accidental catch declarations from 2006 to 2023 including 1843 in France only,
- A very low bycatch mortality rate: 1,8 % including some drifting dead fishes.

A wide and efficient communication awareness campaign:


- From the Gironde-Dordogne to Britany and the Channel,
- International communication from Portugal to Norway.
- → Promote the dissemination of messages.
- → Mobilization of national structures to relay the information to the fishers.

More implication of fishermen for the sturgeon conservation

Impact of the catfish (Silurus glanis) on sturgeon juveniles

Catfish = invasive species in France who is known to be one of the threat for the conservation of diadromous species (ex : GLANISPOMI, 2023)

October 2023: 2000 sturgeons 3 months old are released in historic spawning grounds on the Dordogne river and the Garonne river

03/10/2023: 2 Garonne fishermen doing their activity fished 3 catfishes \rightarrow catfishes regurgitated 17 bodies of juveniles sturgeon released in the morning

→ Fishermen suggested to initiate some regulation actions on spawning grounds to avoid that kind of predation



Observation of bodies of near 20 juveniles of Acipenser sturio eaten by catfishes (October 2023)



→ A working group of NAP stakeholders decide to think about

→ In september 2024 some regulations actions will take place for the forthcoming sturgeon releases with the fishermen help.
